INSTRUCTION MANUAL AND PARTS LIST

INSPECTION

Carefully unpack and inspect your CADDY-VAC for shipping damage. Each unit is tested and thoroughly inspected before shipment, and any damage is the responsibility of the delivering carrier who should be notified immediately.

ELECTRICAL

The CADDY-VAC Back Pack Vacuum is designed to operate on a standard 15 amp, 115 volt, 60 hz, AC circuit*. Voltages below 105 volt AC or above 125 volts AC could cause serious damage to the vacuum motor.

*220/240 volt, 50 hz model is available.

WARNING: To reduce the risk of electrical shock do not expose to rain. Store machine indoors.

Electric motors can cause an explosion when operated near explosive materials or vapors. Do not operate this machine near flammable materials such as solvents, thinners, fuels, grain, dust, etc.

GROUNDING INSTRUCTIONS

To protect the operator from electrical shock this machine must be grounded while in use. The CADDY-VAC is equipped with an approved three-conductor power cord and grounding type plug to fit the proper grounding type receptacle.

EXTENSION CORDS

If an extension cord is used, the wire size must be at least one size larger than the power cord on the machine and must be limited to 75 feet in length. Extension cord must be three-wire grounded.

OPERATION

1. Install a cloth or paper filter/dust collector bag. Slide mounting ring of dust bag over the neck of the hose intake adapter located inside of the tank.
2. Make sure the foam filter is clean and in place over the fan end of the vac motor.
3. Insert the metal clip on bottom of cover into the metal retainer slot on vac housing and close cover. Secure cover to vac housing with clamp (at top of housing).
4. Slide hose adapter into the intake opening and secure with nut and gasket. Attach the hose to hose adapter.
5. Attach the snap hooks of both carrying straps (padded end) to the clips at the top of the vac housing. Attach the snap hooks at the other end of each strap to the clips located on each side of the bottom of the vac housing. Set the CADDY-VAC on the edge of a desk or bench. Slide one arm through each strap and lift the machine on to back. Adjust the strap length to the most comfortable position. **NOTE:** A waist strap is included to be used along with the shoulder straps (Part #83-004.)
6. Attach appropriate cleaning tool to end of hose.
7. Plug the power cord into a properly grounded outlet. (See grounding instructions). The on/off switch is located at the bottom of the machine.

MACHINE MAINTENANCE

Before making any repairs or adjustments on machine, disconnect machine power cord from electrical source.

Replace the paper filter/dust collector bag when approximately two-thirds full. If a cloth bag is used, empty when two-thirds full into covered trash container. Turn bag inside out, brush clean, and reinstall inside machine. **NOTE:** The cloth filter bag can be laundered several times without losing any filtering capabilities.

Check foam filter located on fan end of vacuum motor. If dirty, wash it in a detergent and hot water solution, rinse clean and dry **thoroughly**. Reinstall filter on vac motor. If the foam filter material is damaged, replace filter.

The vacuum motor brushes require inspection after 650 hours of use. To remove vac motor for inspection:

1. Remove 4 screws (Key #21 on parts drawing) holding vac motor to housing.
2. Remove brush hold-down clamps. New brush length is approximately 1". Brushes should be replaced (in sets) when they reach 3/8" length.
3. Inspect vacuum motor intake opening. If fans are clogged with lint and dirt, the fan section should be removed and cleaned, or fans replaced. **NOTE:** Vacuum motors can usually be repaired. However, such repairs should be done by a qualified vacuum repair or electric motor service shop.


Periodic check of hoses, electrical cables, gaskets, etc., will insure trouble-free performance from your CADDY-VAC.










TROUBLESHOOTING CHART

PROBLEM	POSSIBLE CAUSE	SOLUTION
No power to machine.	Dead electrical circuit.	Check building circuit, breaker or fuse box.
	Faulty electrical cable.	Replace.
	Power switch failure.	Replace.
Electrical shock.	Equipment not grounded.	On 3 pronged adapter, be sure ground wire is secured.
Motor speed varies or doesn't run.	Motor brushes worn.	Replace.
	Motor worn out.	Replace.
Loss of Vacuum.	Lint or dirt clogging vacuum hose or tool.	With power off, clean out obstruction.
	Loose cuffs on vacuum hose.	Tighten cuffs turning counterclockwise.
	Faulty vac housing seal.	Replace
	Vacuum motor seals leaking.	Replace
	Broken vac hose.	Replace.
	Worn out vac motor.	Replace.
